## Ontario's Government is Reducing Wait Times for Mental Health and Addiction Center - Trillium Health Partners & Credit Valley Hospital

Ontario Investing **\$4.6 Million** in Critical Hospital Upgrades and Repairs in Mississauga.

Ontario continues to invest in the health and safety of patients as it addresses urgent upgrades, repairs and maintenance to help modernize **131 hospitals** across the province.

Trillium Health Partners will receive funds to maintain their infrastructure and to help ensure a safe and comfortable environment for patients to receive care. Trillium Health Partners will receive the total of **\$4,672,219**.

Ontario is Expanding Behavioral Specialized units to Help End Hallway care. New and enhanced Behavioral Specialized Units are provided one-time start-up funding for staff training, equipment and structural changes, if required.

Mississauga, Canada's sixth-largest city with a population of more than 600,000, is getting its first residential hospice palliative-care center.

A new health center will be built in Mississauga with 220 long-term care beds, and a hospice center that includes 10 residential beds and space for community-based hospice programs.



# SENIORS AND ACCESSIBILITY

## Keeping Seniors Healthy, Safe and Active in Mississauga

Funding of **\$50,000** is part of the Seniors Community Grant program that is providing **\$3 million** to support more than **260 projects** to benefit seniors in communities across the province. The Clarkson Seniors Tours and Entertainment project is a series of organized social events related to arts and entertainment for all seniors, including seniors with disabilities and low-income seniors.

Ontario is committed to helping seniors be **independent**, and in their own communities. Yet, many seniors face financial and other obstacles in accessing programs and services that will help support their overall health and well-being. Ontario is investing towards our Seniors Active Program in South Common Community Centre. Seniors Active Living Centre programs support over 100,000 seniors across the province, and **this funding will provide a variety of programming and activities to help seniors stay active, socially engaged, safe, and healthy.**

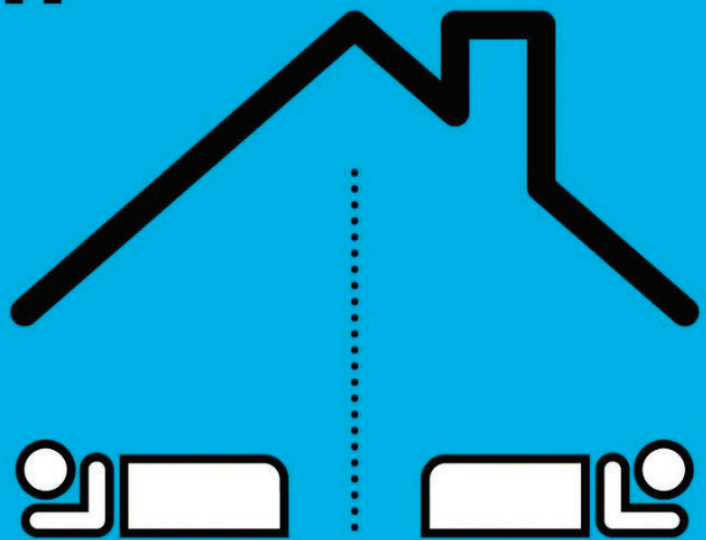

## EDUCATION

Ontario's Government is creating a world class education system which will prepare our students for the jobs of tomorrow.

Ontario is supporting students and protecting front-line teachers by providing \$1,778,999,425 in funding.

Ontario Supporting Mental Health initiatives in Peel - Included in the overall investment of \$174 million is nearly \$30 million for child and youth mental health services and programs across Ontario, as well as more than \$27 million to fund mental health supports in Ontario's education system, which will directly benefit schools, teachers and, most importantly, students and their parents.

Math Supports for Peel Region Students and Parents - In Peel Region, local school boards are offering a three-week, math-focused Summer Learning Program for students in Kindergarten to Grade 5.

This will help students who require additional support minimize summer learning loss, build confidence, increase skills, and have greater success during the regular school year.

## HERITAGE, SPORT, TOURISM AND CULTURE INDUSTRIES

Brampton and Mississauga share in **\$17 million of provincial government funding** for festivals as part of the **Celebrate Ontario 2019 Program**.

Ontario is **supporting 10 non-profit organizations in Mississauga** to improve community spaces in the province and expand or adapt projects that are already making a difference in the community.

The City of Mississauga has been chosen as the host community for the **2022 Ontario Summer Games**, the province's largest multi-sport event, as such, Ontario has invested **\$1 million** towards this event.

Delivering improved infrastructure with a **\$150,000 grant** over 12 months through the Ontario Trillium Fund to create an arts Digital Media lab at the Living Arts Centre that will engage and empower youth between the ages of 12-24.

# TRANSPORTATION

## Mississauga Ready for Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program

Construction begins on Highway 401 Expansion from Mississauga to Milton, Government reducing congestion and improving quality of life for workers, families and businesses. Ontario's government is making life easier for drivers by widening 18 kilometers of Highway 401 from Mississauga to Milton.

Under the public transit stream, a total of \$339 million in federal funding and \$282.5 million in provincial funding has been allocated to the city over the next 10 years. The primary focus is for new transit projects and active transportation infrastructure directly connected to the public transit system.

The company is making face masks featuring an **innovative lip-reading lens**. This new mask will create a unique solution for the **Deaf and hard of hearing community** during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Funding is being provided through the **Ontario Together Fund**.
