### **More Homes for Everyone Act**

- Increasing the Non-Resident Speculation Tax rate
- Reducing backlogs for the Ontario Land Tribunal and the Landlord and Tenant Board
- Expediting approvals for housing, community infrastructure, site planning, and zoning by-laws.

#### **Strong Mayors, Building Homes Act**

 Strengthening the ability of the mayors of Toronto and Ottawa to move priority projects forward and get more homes built faster

#### **More Homes Built Faster Act**

- Reducing prohibitive development charges that added about \$116,900 to the average price of a single-family GTA home in 2021
- Increasing penalties against unethical developers who unfairly cancel projects
- Building transit-oriented communities
- Allowing medium-density housing on existing properties without municipal by-law amendments

#### **Better Municipal Governance Act**

- Ensuring continuity and stability at the regional level by reforming the regional chair appointment process
- Appointing facilitators to ensure municipalities are equipped to tackle the housing crisis

## **Ontario's Plan to Build**







#### 1. Rebuilding Ontario's Economy

- Attracted game-changing automotive sector investments (\$16 billion over the last two years)
- Supporting high-speed internet access to every community by 2026

#### 2. Supporting Workers

- Increased general minimum wage to \$15.50 per hour as of October 1, 2022
- Implemented protections for digital platform workers
- Investing in employment programs and skilled trades
- Allowing ODSP recipients to keep more of the money they earn by increasing the monthly earnings exemption from \$200 to \$1,000 per month.

#### 3. Building Highways and Key Infrastructure

- \$158.8 billion over next 10 years
- Building Highway 413
- Building the Hazel McCallion Line (Hurontario LRT)
- Building the Ontario Line
- Widening Highway 401
- New interchange at intersection of Hwy-427 and QEW

#### 4. Keeping Costs Down

- Eliminating license plate renewal fees
- Cutting gas tax by 9 cents per litre until until December 31, 2023
- Average \$300 in Personal Income Tax relief to 1.1 million taxpayers, through the Low-Income Individuals and Families Tax Credit
- Lowering child-care fees for parents with a \$13.2 billion agreement \$10/day child care by September 2025
- Providing \$185 million in income tax relief for 5,500 small businesses over the next three years

#### 5. A Plan to Stay Open

- Provided Ontario nurses with a retention incentive of up to \$5000 per person
- Launched the Learn and Stay Grant for up to 2,500 eligible postsecondary students in priority programs to work in underserved communities after graduation
- Investing \$230 million in 2022–23 to enhance health-care capacity
- Building the new, state-of-the-art Mississauga hospital
- Expanding the Queensway Health Centre

## "Ontario's Learning Recovery Action Plan for Students"

- \$175 million of catch-up payments: offering parents \$200 or \$250 per child
- New Online Learning Courses
- Modernized curriculum focused on life skills
- \$304 million of additional staffing supports through the COVID-19 Learning Recovery Fund







## \$10/day Child Care by September of 2025



The government of Ontario secured a fair deal for Ontarians by signing a \$13.2 billion agreement with the federal government, in an important step towards lowering child care fees for parents.
